

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Foreword

A visual communication for the ages

The MCOI has rightly chosen to celebrate contemporary illustration in Malta for the third year running. The initiative is all the more noble within the context of the commercially threatening AI generated material and, thus, this publication is a fitting tribute to the creative prowess of illustrators in Malta.

Visual communication has its known beginnings in Prehistoric parietal art, namely in petroglyphs and cave paintings. It served to illustrate the world around Prehistoric man whether real, perceived or symbolic.

Illustration remained a powerful and relevant means of communication over the ages using various media, techniques and styles in line with technological developments and varying contexts. Polychrome Greek marble friezes; Roman frescoes; Byzantine mosaics; Medieval and Renaissance illuminated manuscripts; etchings, engravings and lithographs of subsequent centuries; the nineteenth-century graphic novel; the late twentieth-century video game, are but a few later historic examples that come to mind.

Occasionally, illustrations are strictly tied to and complement the written word. Otherwise, the visual work communicates independently. Sometimes the two approaches actually present themselves concurrently such as in the case of certain Gothic bas-de-pages illuminations that carried a separate narrative from the texts and illuminations above.



The 2023 MCOI Illustration Annual brings together a collection of significant and diverse illustrations that are representative of contemporary illustration in Malta. While all are a manifestation of the creative's own identity, a number of these directly or indirectly reference aspects of visual culture of the past: Greek red-figure vase paintings; Medieval book arts; late nineteenth-century stylistic elements including the organic linear qualities of Art Nouveau, the early influences of photography on painting, and Japanese prints; stylization reminiscent of Cubist and Constructivist works, together with qualities akin to prints dating to the output of Pop Art. Furthermore, apparent inspiration from works of significant Modernist Maltese artists such as Esprit Barthet is also noticeable.

A prevailing element in this selection of illustrations is the reference to Malta and its cultural and historic past. But, rightly so, also issues of the present, including reflections on our natural and built environments, are treated. At times we notice the activist in the illustrator, while on other occasions, there are romantic reminiscences of a lost/dying past or attempts to visually immortalize Malta's fading cultural identity.

Apart from local landscapes, urban representations and interiors, the 2023 MCOI Illustration Annual also presents portraits, some representations of iconic international personalities, and a contemporary interpretation of the vanitas theme, together with commercial material. While certain entries are serious (and sometimes even dark) or satirical in nature, by being rich in meaning and commenting on deep values, others are heartwarming, endearing, enticing, uplifting, light-hearted, playful and/ or positive. Others still are naïve or fantastical. They deal with topics in a variety of ways while appealing to different audiences from the innocent or imaginative beholder to the deeply reflective viewer.

All the above is achieved through a rich variety of techniques of the graphic arts, sometimes featuring the juxtaposition of image and text. Moreover, selected illustrations have been effectively crafted

while skilfully employing the elements of art and principles of design. In particular, one notices: the exploitation of line – still horizontals, dynamic diagonals or organic lines; the careful handling of shape or form in space; images in monochrome, using semi-grisaille, complementary colours or more whether calm or vibrant; interesting textures. Furthermore, the collection shows that these are composed in ways that create balance, emphasis, movement, variety, unity etc. according to that which the illustrator wishes to communicate visually.

Whatever the devices and styles employed, or themes chosen, it is clear that, just like Prehistoric man several millennia ago, contemporary illustrators in Malta are responding creatively to the context around them and are presenting real, perceived or symbolic takes that are worthy of celebration and dissemination for engagement by various audiences.

Working with illustrators

Why use illustration?

Working with an illustrator might be a new experience for some. In truth, hiring an illustrator is similar to hiring any other type of freelance worker, but the creative and visual aspect of the illustration work does mean that there is a certain working tradition and ethic that is specific to the illustration industry. The following is a quick guide to working with an illustrator, including some things to be aware of when preparing your brief or drafting up your contract.

Communications

When getting in touch with an illustrator, the better prepared you are, the easier it will be to work with said illustrator and to foster a good working relationship with them. Here are some tips to keep in mind:

- Have a context ready what is the design brief? Where does the illustrator come in?
- Have a budget and a timescale ready;
- Don't ask an illustrator to copy another illustrator's work, but you can show some images for reference to give the illustrator an idea of what you have in mind;
- Have specs ready sizes / formats / amount of illustrations etc;
- Email etiquette please understand illustrators may be busy with other work and might not be able to fit you in their schedule there and then. Negotiating a budget that is reflective of the urgent nature of a particular request could be a solution in this case;
- Ghosting (withdrawing communication without an explanation) is never a good look. Any delays in the job or with the payment of invoices should always be communicated to the illustrator, preferably in advance.

Licensing and Rights

Illustration is paid on the basis of a licence. As illustration is charged according to its usage - the illustrator will need details of how and where the finished piece is to be used, and over what period of time that work is to be used and what territory it is to be used in to arrive at a price. These uses can vary considerably depending on which area of the market the work is commissioned for.

Avoid asking illustrators to sign a contract which assigns copyright or 'all rights' to the client without first agreeing a price for such uses.

Crediting Illustrators

By properly crediting illustrators for their work, you are supporting illustration as an industry and everyone wins!

Including the illustrator's name when tweetingt their artwork or tagging them when posting to Instagram costs you nothing but a second's thought, and will help build their career.

Crediting Illustrators is particularly important in publishing work. Putting your illustrators' names on front covers helps them build a fan base. People will often buy books because they love the illustrators!

4) Having True Long-Term Value

Investing in original illustrations can provide long-term value for your company. Unique artwork created by an illustrator can become recognisable and iconic, thus helping to build brand recognition and loyalty over time.

5) Standing Out

Al-generated images often exhibit a distinct, glossy surreal artistic style that has become synonymous with computergenerated visuals. Conversely, stock images often adopt a simplistic, generic flat style that aims to appeal to a wide range of buyers. Authentic artistic imperfections contribute to the uniqueness and character of illustrations, whereas machinegenerated imperfections can appear cheap and artificial. By hiring an illustrator, you can ensure that your brand stands out from the crowd, establishing a distinctive visual style that captivates your audience.

6) Intellectual Property Rights

When you hire an illustrator, you have the ability to gain full ownership and control over the artwork they create for you. This ensures that you have the rights to use, modify, and reproduce the illustrations without any legal concerns. AI-generated images and stock images, on the other hand, often come with restrictions and licensing requirements, and there are still several grey areas as to who actually owns the artwork.

7) It Might Actually be Cheaper and Quicker

The time it takes a graphic designer to 'fix' a found illustration, can be time spent

discussing with a skilled illustrator to have an actual custom illustration.

8) Brand Consistency

Illustrators can create illustrations that align with your brand identity, maintaining consistency across all your visual materials. They can incorporate specific brand colours, styles, and themes, ensuring that your illustrations seamlessly integrate with your overall brand strategy.

9) Complete Control Over Output

When it comes to specific requirements like sizing, incorporating multiple layers for animation or aligning an illustration with a particular paragraph of text, hiring an illustrator offers distinct advantages. It's important to note that tools like AI generation and stock imagery can serve as a starting point, but the expertise of a professional illustrator can undoubtedly elevate the quality and refinement of the visuals, surpassing the limitations of these generic resources.

10) Supporting Artists

By hiring an illustrator, you contribute to the growth and recognition of talented artists. You support their craft, creativity, and livelihood, fostering a thriving artistic community. M C V
